Three trophies were presented following the tournament. Mississauga Chrysler won the Championship, trophy and M&S Sales won the Blue & White Consolation Trophy.

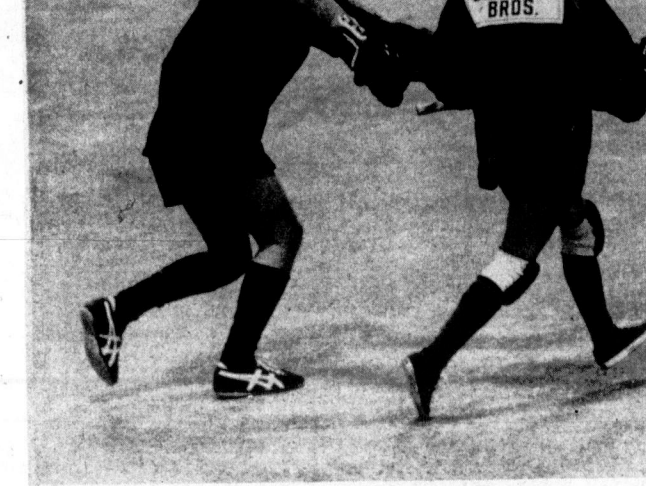
Centennial Caterers were awarded the trophy for the most sportsmanship team.
