## Saxell charged again

A man found not guilty of a crime by reason of insanity, but freed from confinement in a psychiatric institution in a controversial legal decision, has been charged with possession of a dangerous weapon and remanded in custody.

In March, Kaj Saxell of Medallion Court was found not guilty by reason of insanity of possession of a dangerous weapon. On June 24, provincial court judge Kenneth Langdon ruled it was cruel and unusual punishment to order indefinite confinement in an institution since Saxell had been declared not guilty.

Saxell had been charged in June, 1979 after holding his father hostage with a butcher knife while police surrounded the home

Last Tuesday, police say Saxell threatened his brother with a small knife and pierced his bedroom door with a poker while shouting threats. His brother jumped from the second floor window to escape.

Saxell was charged with possession of a dangerous weapon and breach of probation.

Shortly after Judge Langdon's decision, Saxell was charged with common assault in connection with another incident involving his brother
