This day the Sheriff brought M^r. Cornelis Cuyler before this Board by virtue of a warrant directed unto him to whom was tendered the oath to be taken by persons suspected to have traded or traffiqued with any Subject of the French Kings or with any other person for them. according to severall acts of the n^o. Assembly of N^o. York made & provided. and provided by an act of the Assembly Entituled an act for the farther and more effectuall Prohibiting of the selling of Indian goods to the french which oath the said Cornelis Cuyler refused. so y^t. he is convicted of being a trader for Indian goods with the french and forfeited the sum of one hundred pounds to his Majesty for which he has given Recognizance for the payment of 50. pounds
