Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 30th ultimo, reporting that fire had passed through the wooded portion of the Reserve, and that the Indians of Mook's Band are desirous to cut about 60000 feet of the dry and burnt timber, for the purpose of building necessary granaries and implement sheds, etc.

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your favour of the 1st instant, addressed to the Secretary of this Department, with file attached, with reference to the application for clearing made on behalf of one David Moore convicted of supplying liquor to Indians. In reply I have to inform you that free permits may be given to cut the burned and dry timber on the Reserve for the purposes stated, or for fencing the same, etc.
