

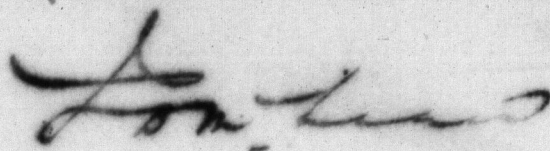
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Ottawa, 15th March, 1911.

Sir:-

I beg to inform you that the Department has learned from Mr. Fuller, Principal of the Algoma Indian Homes, Sault Ste. Marie, that Annie Keyhekobimuse, who has been for sometime a patient in the Toronto Free Hospital, is cured and that he has been informed ~~that~~ she can return home with safety. He also states that an Indian girl named Jessie Neveau now at Sault Ste. Marie requires treatment. Mr. Fuller has been told that he can arrange to have Jessie Neveau sent to the Toronto Hospital, where it is understood he can be received as a patient, under the care of a reliable person. Mr. Fuller has also been told that this person can take back to Sault Ste. Marie, Annie Keyhekobimuse. The Department will pay the maintenance in the Hospital of Jessie Neveau so long as her case requires treatment.
