

You should order them to be made at the nearest convenient point and at a reasonable price. You may note that 9 posts will be required. The letters I.R. should be stamped near the head of each post. They are to be driven to within 10" of the ground and mounds built over them covering the post entirely. It is understood that the settlement of the earth will show the top of the post, and if not, it can be found by a little digging.

The plans should be made on a scale not less than 10 chains to the inch. It should contain all the usual information and measurements also note thereon the posts that you have planted. Enclosed herewith is a copy of General Instructions for Surveyors of this Department. Please read them carefully and be guided by them wherever they may apply.

You will be allowed at the rate of \$10.00 per day exclusive of Sundays and \$3.00 a day for an assistant while in the field. Please engage all other assistants you require at reasonable rates. You are required to furnish all the outfit necessary, for which you may charge 60¢ per day. Note in your diary the proceedings of each day in a concise manner and you are requested to conduct the survey with all the economy consistent with good work.

You will of course understand that the limits of the section are to be ascertained in the manner laid down by the Manual of Surveys for the Dominion Land Surveys. You should show the whole section on your plan and the measurements that you have ascertained as well as the posts you have found.

Blank field books, voucher forms and pay rolls will be forwarded you under separate parcel.
