

OUTLINE OF SPEECH FOR MANSION HOUSE, SEPTEMBER 4, 1941

1. Acknowledgment of Lord Mayor's welcome (See Brockington)
2. Reference to Mr. Churchill (See Brockington,  
also my broadcast to Britain)
3. References to the King and Queen, and Queen Mary  
(See my broadcast to Britain)
4. References to British people: (See broadcast to Britain,  
and reference to their present courage in the light of  
destruction of the past, strain of two years,  
colossal dangers being faced;  
numbers of civilians and others destroyed,  
as well as brave men at sea and in other theatres of war.
5. Canada's position on entering the war,  
at present - attitude and purpose;  
something about contribution already made,  
further contribution to be made,  
(See Brockington, Lapointe,  
also bits of other speeches).
6. Canada's position vis-a-vis Great Britain and the United States,  
(See Brockington),
7. The position of Canada and the United States being much alike,  
as to subsequent effects of war.
8. War aims (See Winnipeg speech.  
Effects of war ending with Germany fulfilling her purpose.
9. Bring out idea that England could save herself at any hour by  
allowing war to end by Germany's control of Europe.
