Never Absent From His Post in a Quarter of a Century.

Mr. Pike, the postmaster of the Palace of Westminster, who will retire shortly under the age limit, after holding that responsible position for more than a quarter of a century, has never been absent for a single hour from his duties on account of sickness, according to The Chronicle, and this in spite of the fact that for many years he was always at his post at 11 o'clock in the morning and did not leave it until an hour or so after the adjournment of the Commons. He has served during nine Administrations, and under ten Postmaster-Generals, and during that length of time has been on the best of terms with members as well as his own staff. During the quarter of a century which Mr. Pike has been watching over the correspondence of members he has seen many changes. Letters and telegrams, he thinks, have increased quite fourfold since he took charge, and, though a great deal of this increase may be set down to the greater activity of the press, it is accounted for in no small degree by the change in the habits of members of the House of Commons, who now transact the bulk of their correspondence at the House, instead of doing it at home. There was only one postoffice with the precincts of the Palace in 1578, now there are four fully equipped in various parts of the building, besides numerous postal boxes and four telephone installations. There are occasions of great pressures in the telegraph department, generally on budget nights, when members are anxious to let their constituents knew what taxes have been put on or taken off. These may be foreseen, but a certain night in 1880 when the dissolution of Parliament was suddenly announced without warning still lives in Mr. Pike's memory as the liveliest experience which the Parliamentary postoffice has ever had.

Cost of Englishmen's Shooting. The extent to which the letting of moors and forests has become recognized as a regular source of income to lord and laird alike in the High-tands, may be judged from the increase in the number of deer forests now annually let. Twenty years ago there were 90 recognized forests. A recent report from the Crofter Comrecent report from the Crofter Com-mission showed 109 of these forests. To-day there are 150. Shootings and forests which let for upwards of and forests which let for upwards of £400 or £500 a year may be counted by hundreds. In the two Counties of Argyll and Inverness alone there are a dozen forests whose rentals average £2,500. Here the cost per day will work out at over £40, exclusive of wages of attendants. The tendency of price is constantly upward.
