

Vegetable Rennets.

Those who would like to make cheese on a very small scale are often troubled to get proper rennet to produce coagulation of the milk. A scientist says that if the leaves of the comm butterwort are placed in a strainer and the milk fresh from the cow is poured over it the milk will soon become thick and has a most delicious flavor. The yellow bedstraw also possesses the properties of curdling milk, and the natives of Cheshire prefer it as a rennet to all other sorts. PRISONER WITH THE PULL. Warden Gilmour Says It's Time to Take

Warden Gilmour Says It's Time to Take Off the Gloves.

Toronto, June 16.—A vigorous attack was made on the parole system of dealing with convicts at a conference in the Parliament Buildings yesterday of Government officials and ladies and gentlemen prominent in the work of reciaiming the fallen members of society. Warden Gilmour of the Central Prison made the allegation that it was "pull" that counted in securing release from prison on parole, and that the reforming influence of the system depended on the character of the officials who administered the law.

The warden, in his attack on the system, remarked that it was time to "take the gloves off." He and others had interviewed three Ministers of Justice. From one Minister, Sir Oliver Mowat, he received a scathing rebuke for daring to suggest the introduction of American ideas.

Going Out to Get Even.

He had known prisoners to leave "the Central," saying, "Good-bye, I'm going out to get even." He had not very strong hopes of the reformation of a man who went into the prison under the age of 25, and he believed the man over that age had the better chance of becoming a useful member of society. Under the B. N. A. Act, he explained, the only man who could grant a parole was the Minister of Justice, and the warden believed that there should be a probation board, which could make a recommendation. The ticket-of-leave system gave the pull to the man who had the money to hire a costly lawyer. "Why, I had a man in the prison who cracked his fingers, saying he had the pull. And, he had the null workers." Going Out to Get Even. skinned Africans along on the pathway of intellectual and industrial progress, and in some parts of South Africa the natives have attained quite a degree of civilization and realize something about what freedom in a large sense means. In others, where the tribes are still wild and ignorant, their chief idea of freedom is extermination of their white rulers.

The Zulus are the strongest and bravest of the Kaffir inhabitants of South Africa. Under their powerful Chief Chaka, who organized his warriors into regiments after the European fashion, they reduced the surrounding tribes to subjection, and it was his son, Cetewayo, with whom the British soldiers had such a sharp conflict about twenty-six years ago.
