BY-LAW NO. 1

A By-law to authorize the Construction of Water Works for the Town of Guelp.

WHEREAS THE CONSTRUCTION of Water-Works and a supply of water for the town of Guelp would promote the comfort of its inhabitants, and afford means for the protection of property from fire, and whereas it is expedient for the Corporation of the town of Guelp to construct certain water-works for the town of Guelp, and to raise by law the sum of \$75,000 for the purpose of paying for the same, and that the sum so created to be raised as hereinafter mentioned, and to be payable in thirty years at full rate from the day on which this by-law shall take effect.

And whereas it will require the sum of five thousand four hundred and eighty-seven dollars to be annually paid by the Corporation of the town of Guelp, in respect of the interest on the said debt, and whereas the amount of the said debt, in respect of the said future increase of the same, was according to the last assessment of the said municipality, the sum of two millions eight hundred and thirty-five thousand nine hundred and twenty-four dollars and seventy cents, and whereas the amount of the said debt, in respect of the said future increase of the same, is for principal the sum of one hundred and eighty-one thousand four hundred and twenty-two dollars, and for interest the sum of one hundred and eighty-one thousand four hundred and twenty-two dollars, and for interest the sum of one hundred and eighty-one thousand four hundred and twenty-two dollars.
