

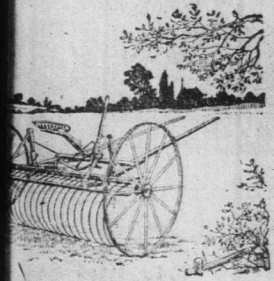

owing to the heavy casualty list
reached the city yesterday the
demonstration that was to take
place at the Railway Station in hon-
or of our returning soldiers and
sailors was postponed. All the de-
cades and bunting being immediately
moved. However a large number of
men, women and children crowded the
station platform and as our heroes
stepped from the train they were giv-
ing a hearty welcome. The returned
soldiers of the Army and Navy were lined
up and received from the Hon. J. R.
Bennett, Acting Premier, on behalf
the Government and people of New-
foundland a wholehearted welcome.
Mr. Bennett spoke in very
moving words of the great sorrow
which has cast a dark cloud over our
land. He felt sure that after a short
time with their loved ones, and when
restored to health they would
come forward to average their
countrymen who now lay cold
death. The boys in blue and khaki
heroes were then placed in au-
tobuses and driven to Government
House where His Excellency the Gov-
ernor extended a welcome to the men
who had done their bit.

A. Parsons, Army Surgeon; Cor-
poral Parsons, Ptes. Wakeley and
Sergeant W. J. Bruce, J. S.
Sergeant, Joseph Hester, Azariah Fa-
jas, R. Barnes, Azariah Mercer,
T. Bugden, Jas. Wheeler and Sam
Smith.

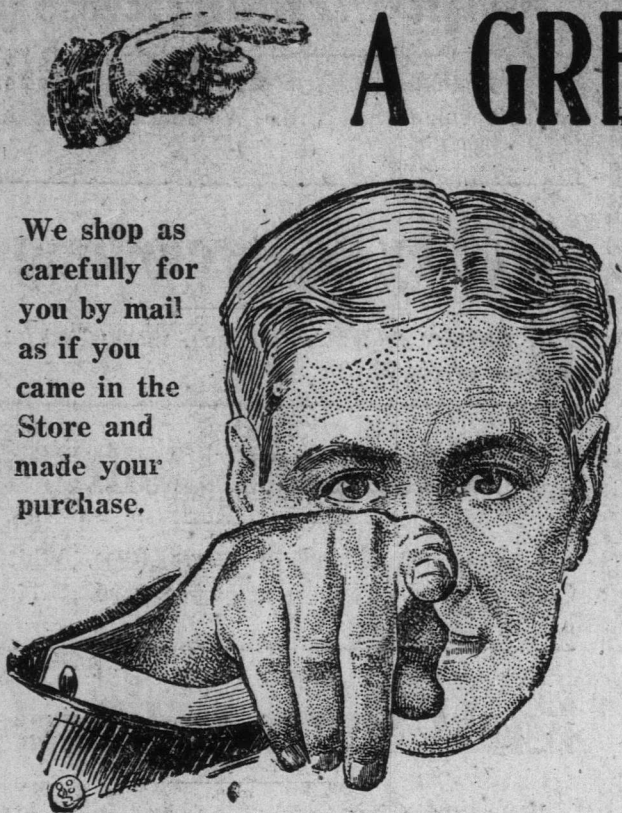
The men were attached to H. M. S.
