NOTICE.

Under the provisions of the "Street Traffic Regulation Act, 1913," it is ordered as follows:—
When more than ten persons gather at the entrance to any Building, wharf, enclosed space or other place of public assembly for the purpose of entering the same, they shall form into line not more than TWO deep, on the inside of the sidewalk close to the building or place to be entered, or in such other manner as the police may direct, and enter the said building, wharf, enclosed space or other place of public assembly in turn quietly and without crowding or pushing. They shall take their position in the rear of the line as they arrive, and shall in no way interfere with other persons entering in their proper order.

Persons committing a breach of this Regulation are liable to a penalty of TEN DOLLARS for each offence.
