### Notes From Brigus.

Mr. J. F. Hearn, who had been on a surveying trip at Bonna Bay, arrived home by Thursday night's train.

J. W. Hiscock's schooner "Vickers-Vimy" (formerly the "Turian"), left for St. John's on Monday evening to load supplies.

On Monday the 7th inst. a very enjoyable concert was held in the C. of E. schoolroom. The programme consisted of songs, choruses and recitations and was entirely carried out by the school children. Ice cream was served during the interval.

The schooner "Clarence B." Parsons master, arrived on Monday evening with a cargo of coal to C. A. Jerrett. The "Emile M. Morrissey," H. Bartlett master, arrived, coal laden the same night. Both vessels were placed on quarantine upon arrival. In the absence of the M.D., the services of Dr. McCleod of Bay Roberts, were secured to release the crew of the "Clarence," but as the "Morrissey" had not arrived at that time, her crew were forced to remain on board till the arrival of Dr. Gill on Tuesday's noon train.

The surrounding hills have been shrouded in smoke for the past week, which is startling evidence of the extensive and destructive fires which are raging in the interior. We have heard of various conflagrations at several wooded localities not very far distant.

The schooners "Clarence" and "Morrissey" commenced discharging their coal cargoes on Tuesday and Wednesday respectively. The price per ton is \$18.00, plus sixty cents for cartage, but Mr. Jerrett offers a rebate of 5% for cash payment.

A very pretty wedding took place at 8 a.m. in the Methodist church, on Wednesday, when the Rev. Oliver Jackson united in the bonds of matrimony Mr. J. Butt of the Cable Office at Placentia, and Miss Mildred Rabbitts, daughter of Mr. J. M. Rabbitts, proprietor of the Cabot Hotel. After the ceremony the bridal party returned by motor to the Cabot, where breakfast was served, whence they entrained to spend the honeymoon. We wish Mr. and Mrs. Butt many years of wedded bliss.

### British Pastor Raps Prohibition.

The 116th anniversary festival of the Licensed Victuallers' School was celebrated with the customary banquet at the Connaught rooms, says the London Daily Telegraph.

Proposing the toast of the "Imperial Forces," the Rev. B. G. Bouchier, whose recent protest against prohibition at a meeting at the Hampstead Garden Suburb, attracted a good deal of attention, said that at this critical moment of our national history, there was an obvious danger that we might barter away the freedom won at so great a cost. He had ventured to take a tiny stand on behalf of one of our greatest liberties.

Prohibition was a determined and considered attempt to destroy one of the most cherished liberties of a freeborn people. The national character, of which we were so proud, had its roots, surely, in good cheer and convivial company. Generous hospitality was an inherited instinct of the British people, and he could conceive no greater injury to our nation at this critical time than the introduction of a measure, against the will of the people, which was bound to embitter and divide the nation, and he had been charged by his opponents with having said that prohibition played into the hands of the Bolshevik and agitator. He repeated that charge. (Cheers.) To introduce a prohibitionist measure when we were harassed by economic and political problems of unprecedented magnitude, would be to do the dead an intolerable wrong. Our national indebtedness stood at £7,000,000,000. What was the good of trying to stir up the working man to do his utmost for the country, and then to take from him that which was first his right, and secondly, not only his drink but his food? (Cheers.) He had not lived in centres of industry for nothing, and he felt that it was contemptible to try to take away from the workers that which he believed was essential if they were to do their utmost. "We may have our faults and habits that need to be corrected," said Mr. Bouchier, "but if they are to be revised and corrected, by God only Britons shall do it." (Cheers.) He urged them to use all the means in their power to defeat this soul-destroying tyranny.
