## The Daily Questionnaire.

WEDNESDAY, April 26.

**SIR M. P. CASHIN**—To ask the Hon. the Prime Minister if on Saturday last a committee from the Board of Trade met the Government to discuss the question of retrenchment in public expenditure and reduction of taxation, and if so what was the result of the meeting; (a), also if at this conference the Government stated that it could not reduce taxation, because it could not, device another means of reducing expenditure than by the \$250,000 which the Premier outlined in the House last week; (b) if the Hon. Minister of Finance and Customs stated that he could not even remove or reduce the duty on gasoline and kerosene for motor boats, and claimed that the fishermen should be more economical and go back to oars, instead of engines; (c) if the Hon. Minister of Agriculture and Mines claimed he had finalized arrangements for selecting the pit props and pulp wood cut the past two winters, and that this material will be marketed without any loss to the Colony, and if so, will the Prime Minister state to the House on what grounds this assertion made and whom are the parties with whom the sales are likely to be made; (d) also if the Hon. Minister of Posts and Telegraphs declared it was the business of the Government to provide fishery supplies for those unable to obtain the same themselves and if it is the Government's intention under these circumstances to undertake providing fishery supplies this summer on such a scale as may be considered requisite, and if so is it the intention to adopt the same method in regard to fishery supplies as last year and if not what is the intention of the Government in regard to this matter; (e) also if the Hon. M. G. Winter, who in the early period of this season represented the Government in the Upper House, asserted at this meeting that the chief blame for the present conditions rested with the Banks, and that steps should be taken to make the Banks more liberal in the issue of credits, and if it is the Government's intention to act on this suggestion, and if so in what manner; (f) also, if the Hon. Minister of Finance invited the Board of Trade Committee to express an opinion as to what should be done with the railway system, and if so, is this to be taken as an indication that the Government are themselves unable to work out some railway settlement, and if so what is the reason that the Government are unable to do so, seeing that it is now two and a half years since they were elected and that their principal appeal to the people of the country at the last election was to return them to office in order to put the Reids in their place and make them carry out the railway contract in the proper spirit and also to say when the Government propose to bring before the House the railway legislation promised for this session. Also if any further between the Government and the Board of Trade Committee are to be held.

To ask the Hon. Minister of Posts and Telegraphs if any further action has yet been taken by the Government with reference to the Commercial Cable Company undertaking general operations in this city, and if so to lay on the Table a copy of any correspondence to make an oral statement regarding the matter.

To ask the Hon. the Prime Minister to lay on the Table of the House a statement showing the amount, if any, claimed by the Government from the Reid Newfoundland Company, as being owed to the Colony on account of the railway, and also a statement of the amount of any claims made by the Reid Newfoundland Company against the Colony in connection with the working of the railway, said statements to be copies of the documents forwarded by the Government to the Reid Newfoundland Company, and received by the Government from the Reid Newfoundland Company.

To ask the Hon. the Prime Minister if the firm of G. and M. Goss, of Spaniard's Bay, which got \$4,000 from the Government last year for fishery supplies, is the firm in which the Hon. Member for Harbor Grace is a partner, and if so, has this firm yet made any return in regard to this money, and if not, has the hon. member for Harbor Grace explained why it has not made any return for this money; if he has, what is the explanation, and if he has not, does the Government intend to take steps to compel the hon. member's firm to make a return, and if not, why not, and does the Prime Minister consider it decent to have a person sitting in this House, whose firm has obtained an amount of money in this fashion and made no return for it, and does the Prime Minister propose to call the attention of His Excellency the Governor to this matter, and if not, why not?

**MR. SINNOTT**—To ask the Minister of Public Works for a detailed statement of mattresses covered and linoleums furnished by L. White to public institutions as listed in public accounts for 1920-21—\$530.33.

**MR. HIGGINS**—To ask the Hon. Prime Minister (1) Upon whose recommendation Sir George Bury's services were procured by the Government, to advise the Government on railway matters; (2) To lay upon the table of this House a copy of all correspondence that passed between this Government and the said Sir Geo.
