## Dates From Colorado.

One region of the Colorado desert where the escape of the Colorado river has more than once caused serious trouble, has been made fertile, the underground water, being utilized for irrigrating several thousand acres.

Among the products which are making this reclaimed land rich are mel-

ons, barley, alfalfa, oranges, grapes, sweet potatoes, sugar, beets and dates. On the agricultural experiment farm at Mecca in this region are to be found rare varieties of dates, which for a long time were produced only in Arabia and the oases of northern Africa, but which are now successfully

It has been found by government experts that the fertility of solia depepends largely on their capacity for retaining moisture. In many western localities crops grow luxuriantly with carcely any summer rain. It is even thought to be possible that the permanent water supply existing at depth of from 40 to 100 feet may be responsible for the ever present
