

DEATH VISITS HOME TWICE IN FOUR DAYS

Charles McGill Passes Away a Few Hours After Father's Funeral.

Death laid a heavy hand on the family of the late Neil McGill, 863 Queen's avenue, and in the short space of four days removed both father and son, leaving to mourn their loss the mother and daughter of the family. Yesterday a few hours after the funeral of Mr. McGill, Charles, a son, passed away.

Neil McGill, the father, a member of St. John's Lodge, No. 29, A. F. and A. M., and an elder in St. Andrew's United Church, died Sunday evening after being ill only fifteen minutes. He had attended church services at St. Andrew's both morning and evening.

Mr. McGill, sen., had been connected with the Massey-Harris company as sales agent for the London district for many years past, having entered the service of this organization in 1891 at the time of the amalgamation of the Massey company with the Harris and Furber firms.

Few other men were as widely known or as generally respected in the farming community around London as was Mr. McGill. He was ever ready to aid his customers in every way, and because of his genial manner and wide knowledge of the implement business, he was always a welcome guest with hundreds of farmers in the London area.

His funeral was held yesterday afternoon, and last evening Charles, aged 23 years, died after an illness of over six months. In May of the present year he contracted an attack of influenza, which resulted in an affection of the heart. The sudden demise of his father aggravated this condition, and his death was the result.

Mr. McGill had been employed last year by the board of education as a teacher in the Pottersburg school. He was an active worker in St. Andrew's church and had been always a president of the Young People's Federation there, and more lately the secretary of that organization.

Mrs. McGill and one daughter, Margaret, are the sole survivors of the family.

The funeral of Charles McGill will be held from the family residence tomorrow afternoon to Woodland cemetery, and will be of a strictly private nature.

FEW SPOILED BALLOTS IN SCHOOL ELECTION

Junior Citizens' League at Alexandra Teaches Use of Franchise.

In view of the forthcoming election it is interesting to note the work that is being done in at least one of the public schools of the city in teaching pupils the privileges and responsibilities of the franchise and in instructing them in the manner of voting.

In last year's election of officers of the Junior Citizens' League of the Alexandra public school, out of a total of 160 votes cast, each of a total of full slate of twelve names, there was only one spoiled ballot. Furthermore, in this miniature community every citizen, without a single exception votes at every election.

The executive of the league have charge of all school activities, conduct the opening exercises each day and the various special programs throughout the year. The Alexandra school newspaper, "The Alexandra Buzz," is in charge of the school orchestra and conduct the school reading-room.

Owing to the unusually large number of pupils leaving the school in June and the large number of new pupils entering last September, the school's list of pupils has been found to be inaccurate and daily sessions of the court of revision are being held, superintended by Mr. R. E. Dewar, principal.
