Queen Adelaide Reaches Port

Brings Heavy Cargo From the Orient-Japanese Steamship Disaster.

Letter Received Yesterday From One of the Tilikum's Voyagers.

Steamer Queen Adelaide arrived at the outer whart yesterday morning at ter a rough trip from the Orient, being delayed three days, by heavy gales encountered off the coast of Japan, which prevented her making much headway. The storms were encountered from Kohe, and when a day out she passed the China Mutual steamer Yangige inbound to Kohe, laboring like the Queen Adelaide in the contused seas caused by the heavy winds. It was a stormy trip throughout. The Queen Adelaide brought a total carge of 5,200 tons of freight, of which she landed 192 tons, mostly sugar, at the outer wharf.

From Kobe she brought news of the loss of the Tsuruhiko Maru, a Japanase steamer of 2,000 tons, engaged in carying coal from Kobe to Hongkong, with a crew of 50 all told, and of this company, but one man escaped the wreck. The steamer, which was owned by Messrs. Olchura & Co., of Tokio, left Kobe for Keelung on October 4 and after loading her coal carge at Moji, she put to sea, and on the morning of October 7 went ashore on Mejima island, in Goto archipelago, and soon became a total wreck. But one of the crew reached shore. The Suruhiko Maru was formerly the Chittanoga, and was purchased by her Japanese owners at a cost of 130,000 yen.
