Yet when we hear that the passenger pigeon, one of the most extraordinary and characteristic birds of this hemisphere, is entirely extinct, people have not the intelligence to be even sorry. Yet it formerly existed in the Northern States and in Canada in countless millions. The passenger pigeon was exterminated through sheer, brutal, reckless and wanton slaughter, by so-called civilized people."

Under the protection the birds now enjoy it seems that the gannets and cormorants of the islands of the Gulf will increase to an amazing number. And although their cries are somewhat loud and disagreeable, and they are accused of destroying baby trout and salmon to some extent, they have proved of great value in acting as scavengers of the coast, cleaning up the cod-heads thrown back into sea by the fishermen. The fishermen regularly throw out a feed for the birds every evening, and it is a pretty sight at sunset to see the flash of a thousand wings as the gannets settle near the shore to enjoy their repast.

Mr. Taverner, the well-known ornithologist of Ottawa, some years ago took panoramic pictures of the rock ledges estimated that it was the home of about eight thousand gannets, not to mention the six or eight other varieties known to live there. These different bird families apparently keep house together in perfect harmony, and have done so through years which date back beyond the history of man.
