### THE ORANGE BILL BURKED

PROBABILITY THAT THE MEASURE  
WILL BE WITHDRAWN.

Insistent Traders—The Northern Railway bill, which has been introduced in the House of Commons, is being vigorously opposed by the merchants and traders of the city. It is believed that the measure will be withdrawn.

On the third reading of the bill to incorporate the Northern Railway, Mr. Blake proposed an amendment that ten years after the corporation should have acquired any property, they should not be permitted to hold any more than was required for their own use.

On the second reading of the act respecting the Northern Railway, received from the Senate, Mr. Blake proposed an amendment that the directors should not be permitted to issue any shares of the company.
