Exhibition Baseball at Rosedale-International Football on the Jarvis Street Grounds-A Capital Race with the Hounds-Shooting, Rowing and Other Things.

"You've got a big crowd here for a practice game," remarked the World to a director of the Toronto Baseball Association on arrival at the Rosedale Grounds yesterday afternoon. "We have," was the reply, "but there's no one playing ball all winter." And the worthy director was right. Profiting by last year's experience the Association and Manager Humphries, be it particularly noted, have taken the public into close confidence, and there's nothing the members of the said public enjoy so much as believing they know everything. In other words, whatever the Association has been doing, or intended to do, has been given to them openly and straightforwardly. There has been little or no mystery, and the distrust and lack of confidence which obtained antecedently last year under a different policy have entirely disappeared. And those who say that the journey northwards had no chance for a run, or for an April or any other date the weather was glorious, and the playing, if not exactly up to championship form, was at least creditable to all concerned. There was not that excitement, it is true, that characterizes "a game for blood," but there was a deal of good feeling in the air and among the players there was no slovenliness. In their bright new costumes the Toronto had an excellent business-like look, which in itself was an attraction, and their work was on the whole clean although perhaps scarcely so energetic as it would have been under other circumstances. In fact, it is possible that the company in which they found themselves, and the character of the game, was such as to induce a showiness or stand play-which characteristically said company, the boys from the variety, were in left field being especially worthy of mention; but by the same token, also getting a run which was started by clever tactics on his part. As to the play of the Toronto it would be injudicious to say much. The game was not a fair test of their ability, but sufficient was seen to prove to the baseball admirer of this city that this year they have a team which, if it does not carry all before it, will, if good work and close business signify anything, at least deserve success. men and huntswomen in scarlet or black coats and habits made up a picturesque scene in the vicinity of the famous old valley. Hanlan and Beach. "Nod Hanlan was seen by the World yesterday. He was looking bronzed as a mariner of seven years' voyage and as hale and hearty. He had been, he said, three weeks at work, and had already reduced considerably, his weight now being 165 lbs. by his rowing clothes he weighed 170 lbs, when he commenced. He rowed probably ten miles a day, and as for walking exercise he was always at it.

Being asked if he had heard anything from England in reply to his challenge from Beach, he said Mr. W. J. Innes, the gentleman to whom he cabled, had sent him a very nice letter, stating that he had traveled all over London to find out if Beach had a representative in England, and had discovered that he had not. He had put the challenge in all the papers, and that as soon as Beach arrived he would close a match for Hanlan over the water, for a course for \$2000 a side, the race to take place in October. Word had been received in England that Wallace, Ross and Tomer were certainly going to cross the Atlantic and there was a proposition to get up a big sweepstakes race in boats at \$2000 each with \$200 added.

Hanlan, it might be mentioned, is accompanied in his practice by Bright, who is training for Griffin of Buffalo, and O'Connor.

Mr. Innes writes from London to the effect that he had been to see the Hamiltons in that city about May 17. He will endeavor to bring Hanlan and the Australian together on the Titanic. Hanlan is much at home on this course, and Beach will have no advantage over him, as on the Parana. Mr. Innes thinks that the first international contest will be open to all at \$500 each, with \$2000 added. A Big Regatta for Toronto. Nod Hanlan is arranging a big regatta to take place on the lake of the Island, Friday and Saturday, June 4 and 5.
