

WEIGHTS AND MEASURES

Traders, Manufacturers and Owners of Weighta, Measures and Weighing Machines generally are specially requested to read carefully the following instructions and act accordingly:

The Weights and Measures Act provides for a regular biennial inspection of all Weights and Measures used for trade purposes, as well as for irregular inspections of the same, which may be made at any time when deemed necessary by the inspector, and it also imposes a heavy penalty on any trader or other person who wilfully obstructs or impedes an inspector or assistant inspector in the performance of his duty under said Act, or who refuses to produce the whole of his weights and measures for inspection when called upon to do so by an inspecting officer.

2. Every Trader, Manufacturer and Owner of Weights, Measures and Weighing Machines when paying moneys to inspectors or Assistant inspectors of Weights and Measures for verification fees a sentitled to, and is specially requested to, demand from the officer who makes the inspections an official certificate ("Form 0.6" with the words "Original for the Trader" printed at the head hereof) properly filled out and stamped, and also it the same time to carefully ascertain whether r not the stamps attached to such certificate expresent exactly the value the amount of cashipald. Traders are requested to bear in mind had certificates of verification are of no value whatever unless stamps covering the full amounts of fees charged are attached.
