So, too, was the emotional jealousy which all her life long proved that even a woman of genius can not transform herself into a man. The rather late regrets which she expressed for the improprieties of her early life are of interest in explaiding her relations with Alfred de Musset.

Consi derable light has been thrown on these much disputed relations of late, says the Paris correspondent of The New York Post, in a way that must materially change the appreciation made of

says the Paris correspondent of The New York Post, in a way that must matertally change the appreciation made of them by such writers as Paul Linden and our own Henry James. The lady who writes under the name of Arvede Barine believes that she has finally solved the puzzle. But it has been left for M, Augustin Filon, the one time projector of the Prince Imperial, to state them with a man's brutal frankness. Now that the old horror of French novels is passing away from English-reading circles, it is a service to morality to state—with propriety—what the life was which served as a basis to a literature that conservative people are blamed for not recognizing at its true value.

It is known that George Sand and Alfred de Musset tried to imagine themselves a new Heloise and Abelard, or a Romeo and Juliet, but without permanent success. After the poet's death a series of books appeared with titles that might have given a hint for Rider Haggard's "She." The lady who was rightly apprehensive that her former flame sickly burn her from his tomb. was the

ly apprehensive that her former flame might burn her from his tomb, was the first in the field with "She and He." It threw all the fault of the rupture, of their relations on his childish emotional, their relations on his childish emotional, and generally unbearable 'character. His brother Paul retorted with "He and She," in which the novelist was accused of betraying her lover while he lay at death's door under her care in Venice. It seems that the poet desired that this should be some explanation of the miserable and besotted ending of his own career, which had begun so brilliantly. Then a Mme. Louise Colet, hitherto unknown, came forward with hitherto unknows, came forward with an exclusive claim to the disordered affections of the poet, in a volume called "She." A wit summed up the unsavory condition of the whole set in a final

book, "They."

The new disclosures show that between the two principals in this very French life-drama there is but little to choose in point of common truth and honor. Common morals, of course,

were not to be expected.

It was Saint Beuve (a lay confessor of all these emancipated men and women of letters) who started the Musset-Sand menage, at Madam's request. He had already failed in bringing her and Prosper Merimee together. She persuaded the mother of Mile. Alfred, as his schoolmates nicknamed him—he was many years her junior—to allow her to take him off to Venice. There, at the end of the dangerous illness through which she nursed him, it now appears that he quite willingly abandoned the field to his Italian doctor and came on to Paris by himself. Instead of the famous rupture, which has hitherto been supposed to have caused his death after twenty years of disappointment in love, when Mine. Sand and her doctor returned to Paris Musset was on the best of terms with both. him off to Venice. There, at the end of

At last the Italian, tdoubtless confused, withdrew and the genius were left to themselves. In three months they separated by mutual con-sent, remaining good friends for several years after.
