CHEAP FRUIT CARE.—One cup of butter, one-half-cup of molasses, two eggs, one cup of sugar, three cups of flour, one tablespoonful each of cloves and cinnamon, a little nutmeg, one teaspoonful of soda and fruit to taste. This recipe mak a two loaves.

A DISINFECTING MIXTURE.—Make a solution of one and one half waste of privice add.

GRAVE MARMALADE—AMNER COLOUR.— Separate the skins and pulp of the grapes and cook the pulps until the seeds separate, strain it, and to four quarts of pulp add two quarts of sour apples, measured after cooking, the grated rind of three good lemons and nine pounds of sugar; let it get hot before the sugar is put in, and cook for half-an-hour after it having to hell. it begins to boil.

APPLE MERINGUE.—Prepare six large tart apples for sauce. While hot put in a piece of butter the size of an egg. When cold, add a cup of fine cracker crumbs, the yolks of three eggs well beaten, a cup of sweet milk or cream, a little salt, nutmeg and sugar to taste. Bake in a large plate, with an undercrust of rich paste and a rim of puff paste. When done, take the whites of the eggs, half a teacup of white sugar and a few drops of essence of lemon; beat to a stiff froth, pour over and put back into the oven to brown lightly.
