### **PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS OF ONTARIO**

The Inspector of Prisons and Public Charties for Ontario will receive tenders up to noon of

### Saturday, 10th May,

for the delivery of the following quantities of Coal at the sheds of the institutions named, on or before 1st July, 1879, as follows.

Asylum for the Insane, Toronto. 800 tons Hard Coal, large egg. 175 tons stove size 250 tons Soft Coal.

Asylum for the Insane, London.

1,500 tons Soft Coal, 200 tons Hard, large e.g., and 80 tons Chestnut.

### Asylum for the Insane, Kingston.

1,600 tons Soft Coal, 50 tons Hard, large equ., 40 tons small egg; and 10 tons chestnut.

#### Asylum for the Insane, Hamilton.

800 tons Soft Coal (to, tons to be delivered at the pumping house in the city, the remainder at the Asylum sheds): 25 tons Hard, Chestnut, and 25 tons store size.

# Central Prison, Toronto.

750 tons Soft Coal, and 60 tons Hard, stove size.

#### Institution for the Deaf and Dumb, Belleville.

350 tons Soft Coal: So tons Hard, small egg: and 20 tons stove size.

#### Institution for the Blind, Brantford. 550 tons Soft Coal . 150 tons Hard, stove size.

The hard coal to be either Pittston, Scranton, or Lehigh. Tenderers to name the mine or mores from which the soft coal is to be taken, and the exact quality of the same and if required, to produce satisfatory evidence that the coal delivered is true to name. All coal to be delivered by 1st July, in a manner satisfactory to the authoraties of the respective instinutions.

Two sufficient securities will be required for the due fulfilment of the contract, or each of the contracts, as the tenders will be received for the whole supply specified, or for each institution separately.




