Victoria imported last month free goods worth \$24,017 and dutiable ones valued at \$224,216, or together \$248,223, with \$4,388 additional for Chinese poll tax and miscellancous revenue. The customs duties thus collected show a gain of \$\$,325.69 on those of the same mouth of 1892. The exports for the month were worth \$662,801, of which \$585,370 in value represented Canadian products.
