receive those funds and disburse them under the direction of the Committee. The Committee shall also determine the days of the year on which the Annual Meeting of the Association shall be held, and the programme of exercises for each meeting (vid.

- (2.) The Association shall appoint a Secretary, and, if necessary an Assistant Secretary, who shall keep a record of the proceedings of each meeting, and forward a report to the Superintendent of
- (3.) The Superintendent of Education shall preside at the meetings of the Association and of the Executive Committee. At his request another member may preside, and in his absence the Association or Committee shall choose its own presiding officer.
- (4.) The Superintendent of Education is authorized to use the Normal School Building and appliances for the meetings of the Association when they are held in Truro, and the Principal and Professors will aid to the extent of their power in promoting the success of such meetings. The Pupil-Teachers will be admitted to exercises, but not as members of the Association, save when enroiled under Section I. 2.
- (5) Teachers can claim the same privileges in respect of attendance at meetings of the Association, as are given them by regulation in regard to attendance at District Associations.
- (6.) The Superintendent of Education shall have, in respect to the first meeting of the Association, the power conferred on Executive Committee by I. 1.

# 5. As to Classification of Teachers.

On and after November 1st, 1879, the Licensed Teachers of the Province shall be classified as follows:

Note—The licenses resulting from the annual examination in July, 1879, have been issued in accordance with the above regulation. C and D Licenses issued to Fennales prior to 1879, were issued and known as first and second-class licenses, respectively; henceforth such licenses will not be distinguished as to class from similar licenses issued to male teachers and are registered and published as Second and Third-class Licenses. Inspectors should be careful to understand this change themselves, and explain it to Teachers and particularly to Trustees.

### 6. As to Time of Summer Vacation.

The regulations regarding the time of the summer vacation shall

he modified so as to read :-

The vacation shall commence on the Monday preceding the Annual Examination of Teachers, but the Commissioners of each District shall have power to change the time of this vacation, provided that it shall not begin earlier than the first of July nor later than the first of August. Any change made must apply to all the Schools of the District, and due notice thereof must be given by the Inspector to the Trustees.

### 7. As to Teachers' Associations.

Teachers' Association may be organized either for an entire Inspectoral District, or for each of the Counties, or parts of Counties, composing it, as on consultation by the Teachers with the Inspector and Superintendent of Education, may be found most desirable.
