REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

As a Special Operating Agency operating under a cost recovery basis, the Passport Office finances its operations entirely from revenues generated by fees received for the provision of travel documents. The Passport Office must break even over a four-year cycle. In 1997-98, revenue reached \$54.3 million, an increase of \$5.5 million (11.2 percent) from last year. Total expenditures for the year were \$48.6 million, an increase of \$6.2 million (14.6 percent) from 1996-97. This resulted in a \$5.7 million surplus on an accrual basis.
