THE POPULATION COMMISSION, A FUNCTIONAL COMMISSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL COUNCIL, IS HOLDING ITS 9TH SESSION IN NEW YORK FROM FEBRUARY 25 TO MARCH 8, 1957.
