The Secretary of State for Enternal Affairs, the Honourable Howard Green, announced today the appointment of Mr. Henry F. Davis, at present Head of the Department's European Division, as Chief of Protocol. He succeeds Mr. H.F. Feaver, whose appointment as Ambassador to Switzerland was announced carlier. Mr. Davis will take up his new duties shortly.

Hr. Devis this born in Ottown, Ontario, in 1914. He is a graduate of Bishop's University, and received his BCL at HeGill University in 1935. He was called to the Bar of Quebec in 1936 and was employed by the Royal Trust Company in Montreal from 1936 to 1940. In 1940 he joined the Royal Canadian Air Force and served overseas in Bonber Connand. He was shot down on a bombing raid in the autumn of 1943 and was discharged as a Flight Lieutement on returning to Canada in 1945. He joined the Department of Esternal Affairs in 1946. He served in Duchos Aires from 1947 to 1950, and in Paris from 1954 to 1958 where he had the rank of Hinister-Counsellor and was Charge d'affaires for periods. In 1950 he attended the National Defence College in Kingston. Since his return to Ottema in 1958 Hr. Davis has been Head of Duropean Division. He has been a member of the Comedian Delegations to the Ministerial Hestings of the North Atlantic Council in 1958, 1959, and 1960 and he attended the sessions of the General assembly of the United Mations in 1958 and 1959 as a special advisor to the Canadian Delegation. For tuo periods Mr. Devis has been noting assistant Under-Scoretary of State for External Affairs.
