2. Is there a requirement that they must (a) do 35 investigations per month (b) launch at least one prosecution per month and, if not, what is the requirement in each case?

Mr. Dennis Dawson (Parliamentary Secretary to Minister of Employment and Immigration): 1. There are currently 151 investigation and control officers in the province of Ontario.

2. There is no requirement that the commission's investigation and control officers must complete a specific number of investigations or launch a specific number of prosecutions. As part of the normal budgetary and resource planning and allocation process, the commission's field offices are, of course, required to make estimates of work volumes and to translate these volumes in terms of financial and personnel resource requirements. This is a normal budgetary exercise that is essential to the responsible management of scarce resources. It is quite possible that these budgetary estimates are at times misinterpreted. However, the commission has said before, and reiterates now, that there are no investigation or prosecution quotas or requirements in Ontario or elsewhere in Canada.
