With respect to the Canada Post Corporation, (a) how many hectares of undeveloped land does it own (b) how many hectares of developed vacant land does it own (c) what is the total market value of the land?

GOVERNMENT EXPENDITURES RESTRAINT ACT, 1993 NO. 2

ALLOCATION OF TIME TO CONSIDER REPORT AND THIRD READING STAGES OF BILL C-113

Hon. Otto Jelinek (Minister of National Revenue): Mr. Speaker, I move, pursuant to Standing Order 78(3):

That, in relation to Bill C-113, an act to provide for government expenditure restraint, not more than one further sitting day shall be allotted to the consideration of report stage and one sitting day to the consideration of the third reading stage of the bill; and
