Dear Sir Arthur, I should have written to you some days ago advising you of the decision of the Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of Pederation in regard to School of Social work scholarships. The decis ion was unanimous in regard to the outright scholarship of type #1, it being felt that the satiscribing public was not educated up to the point of giving through the Federated drive for scholarship purposes. I am sure you will realise that many of our subscribers feel that all our money should go to buy food, clothin and shelter. The decision inregard to orkers in Training scholarships was also adverse. The Budget Committee recommended the granting of some of these scholarships but the Executive Committee did not see their way to do it this year. You will understand that the Budget for the carrent year was made up last Fall and to start such scholarships on October 1st would involve an extra appropriation from this years budget. Some extra appropriations have already been given that were considered to be essential but the reserve furns now are too low for them to feel safe in granting this extra appropriation.
