In conclusion your committee wishes to point out that in submitting a draft <sup>curriculum</sup> it fully realizes that the draft is tentative and ~~would~~ <sup>it</sup> have to be modified from time to time in the light of experience.

There still remains a great deal of work to be done in working out the details of the suggested readings, and it will be necessary to take up with the General Council of the Bar the question of amending their regulations so as to recognize our course, even though we do not comply with their present regulations as to lecture requirements. We suggest in this connection that the Bar be requested to abolish all formal requirements as to the course and that in exchange we offer the Bar the privilege of supervising our examination papers and the standard exacted from students, and in addition representation on our examination board. While certain inconveniences may attach to this proposal, we feel that they are more than counterbalanced by the advantages gained. *The changes should take effect with the class entering the Faculty in the fall of 1926.*
