This would have the advantage of covering. three more of the general subjects represented in the Library of the Carnegie Demonstration and would leave a similar group of subjects for possible treatment during the third year of the Demonstration. (c) More technical instruction, by means of round tables or seminars, in the general subject of eugenics, with possible emphasis on 1. Fox Breeding. 2. Child Welfare. both of which subjects are of immediate significance in Prince Edward Island. With these suggestions regarding financing and content, there is involved the question of personnel. I would recommend that the administration of such a course, if approved, be still in the hands of the Library School, with the co-operation of the Director of the Department of Extra-Mural Relations, and that consideration be given to suggestions regarding local lecturers. It would not be a difficult matter to provide you almost immediately with a detailed outline of the proposed content of such a scheme. I might add that, in my opinion, there would be a distinct advantage to library development in Eastern Canada if some such scheme could be continued during the period of the Carnegie Demonstration in Prince Edward Island.
