of England became those of Ireland, and this Kingdom, under the Name of a Lordship, became a Dominion of the Crown of England, inseparably annexed and knit thereto, and dependant thereon; this annexation or dependency, sounded on Conquest, Cession, and Acknowledgment, is clearly declared and recognized in many of our Acts of Parliament, some of which I shall briefly mention.

The 28th of Hen. VIII. Cap. 2; Entitled, "An Act of Succession of the King "and Queen Anne," recites that several perfons had pretended titles "to the Imperial "Crown of the Realm of England, where unto this your Land of Ireland is aperpending and belonging."

28 Hen. VIII. Cap. 3. "The Act of "Absentees,"—begins with this recital "For-"assuch as it is notorious and manifest "that this the King's Land of Ireland, "heretofore being inhabited, and in due "obedience and subjection unto the King's "most
