These insects represent other groups of the lace-wing type. The upper one is *usnylus*, which is much like the mature form of the ant lion; but its grub is semi-aquatic. The lower one, *drepanopteryx*, is at first, right like a moth, but close inspection shows the lace-like structure. Observe the remarkable hooks by which the fore and hind wings are locked together for flight.
