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little assistance on his part, would bring them up to him; but the Jesus, the Saviour of the Church of the Popes, has hands too white and too pure to touch, with the tip of his finger these wretches. He respects himself too much to notice such rabble; he sees them then, fall and being bruised at the foot of the ladder without caring the least in the world.

Yes, once more, behold him, the Saviour fashioned by the Popes, such as the Church of Rome herself paints him, in her famous book of the Glories of Mary!

But after having seen with what sovereign contempt the Church of Rome represents the Saviour of the world, let us see what marvellous power, what love and what mercy are attributed to Mary.

"Index they were exhorted to ascend the white ladder, and on that he saw them succeed, for the blessed Virgin offered them her hand, and they arrived in that manner safe in paradise. Who will ever be saved? Who will ever reign in heaven? They are saved and will certainly reign, for whom this queen of mercy offers her prayers." (Glories o Mary, page 279.)

These last words neither need explanation nor comment.

Every Roman Catholic whose heart is true and honest will easily see that in his church, the Saviour whom they preach to him, cannot be the Saviour o
