ELECTRIC RAILWAY SWITCH WORK.

Of the various departments which go to make up the electric railway of today the most insignificant of all to the average layman is the track department. Ninety nine out of a hundred pedestrians will walk over a large intersection without even glancing at it, much less comprehending the time, labor and money involved in fabricating and installing it.
