VICTIM'S EYES HAUNT HICKEY

Murderer of Boys Shows the Greatest Remorse Over Accidental Killing of Edward Morey.

BUFFALO, Nov. 30 .- (Can. Press.) PORCUPINE, Nov. 30.—Captain H. C. Anchor of the Dome Extension went to Night Hawk Lake yesterday morning in company with a party of claim holders who have properties not far distant from those which were recently sampled by the Canadian Exploration Company. The party will spend several days on the claims sampling them and there is a possibility of another large deal as a result. The trip to this property has been contemplated for some time, but had been postponed until such a time as the Journey could be made across the lake on the ice.

BUFFALO, Nov. 30.—(Can. Press.)

Disregarding the advice of his attorney, John F. Hickey, the confessed boy murderer, today repeated to a group of newspaper men the story of his many crimes, covering a period of over twenty years. Strangely enough, Hickey seems to be more troubled by the memory of the accidental killing of Edward Morey, in Lowell, Mass., nearly thirty years ago and a year ago, when he took little children by the throats and strangled them. throats and strangled them.

In addition to the murder of the Joseph and Kruck boys, Hickey related unsuccessful attempts to murder boys in Quiney, Boston and Lawrence, and

four attempts to suicide. "I do not know what this thing is that comes over me," he said. "This obsession strikes me when I am sober and I take to drink to get over it. Then I kill some boy. I see Morey's eyes before me. That comes over me at any time night or day, drunk or
