QUALITY ACCOUNTS FOR VARIED PRICE

T. Eaton Manager Explains Difference in Bacon Rates Bought by Board.

So many wrong and even fake impressions have got abroad concerning the variation in prices charged by the individual stores for bacon and ham, owing to the theatrical display before Commerce Board Commissioner Commerce Board Commissioner Connor on Thursday, when some of his agents produced pounds of bacon and ham bought at prices varying from 12 to 20 cents, that The World yesterday set out to clear up the mat-ter. There are as many parts of a hog when made into bacon as there are articles to one of those little bags a woman carries on her wrist, and the

woman carries on her wrist, and the prices vary according to the part of the hog from which the bacon is cut. Mr. Beamish, the manager of the meats department of the T. Eaton Company, probably knows more about "cuts" of every kind of meat than any man in Toronto. He told The World yesterday that it was decided-ly unfair to compare, for instance, a pound of bacon taken from one part of the hog, with that cut from anoth-er and Probably inferior part. It would be just as reasonable to buy a pair of boots at one store for \$8.00 and another pair at the next store for \$12.00 and say, Here are two pairs of boots. Why the difference in pairs of boots; why the difference in price? Quality in price consideration must always be taken into account. For instance, go to Eaton's and ask for a pound of ham consisting of first slices, and then go to another store and get a pound off a ham which had been depleted by seven or eight slices and then complain prices were different. True, it was all

prices were different. True, it was all ham, but of a different quality. The above wars the principle on which the inspectors for the board of commerce worked—they bought the highest quality in one store and the second of third quality in another and then complained because the Prices were not equal. There is no need to were not equal. There is no need to go outside Eaton's store to find var-iety in price—it just depends on the quality and the part of the ham or bacon required. Cottagers' bacon, a bacon required. Cottagers' bacon, a splendid looking bacon, can be bought at 47 cents per pound, or bacon pur-chased at an enhanced figure, but they are both bacon. Quality for quality and part for part, the Eaton store is not in any way above-rather below—any other store in town. Their system of checking is perfect and even should the clerk who cut the bacon make a mistake in weight it will be discovered before the parcel is given out as it is weighed a second

time before being packed. The difference between prices of bacon and ham at the various stores seems to be but a vision of the board of commerce.
