The liabilities are \$1,762,435, as compared with \$3,283,927. The assets are \$775.821, as compared with \$1,542,892.

Some explanation must be forthcoming for the extraordinary case of British Columbia where the liabilities for the quarter have fallen from \$625.604 to \$89,900, and the assets from \$425.559 to \$59,040. In Ontario, the liabilities were reduced from \$1,208,282 to \$792,867, and the assets from \$491,769 to \$346,636.
