POLES USING GUN METAL TO BUILD HERO'S MONUMENT

WARSAW. Dec. 9.—The Poles are using some of the gun metal taken by their army from the Bolsheviki to cast a monument to be erected in this city to Father Skorupka, the heroic young army chaplain called "the Saviour of Warsaw."

It was Father Skorupka who led the first successful charge that turned the tide when the Red Army was at the gates of Warsaw on August 15. He fell before Bolshevik bullets, but his regiunique and effective personalities who stand out from among the turbulent masses in present-day Italy.

Among the men of his regiment, many of whom were either his schoolmates or pupils of the school in which he was a teacher, he was idolized. Today his name is revered by all Poles. A competition among the leading sculptors of the country will be held to choose the design of this monument.

The Garibaldi Co-operative. Guilietti organized the Garibaldi Co-operative just after the war. At that time the seamen had just won an increase of 50 lire per month to meet the rising cost of living. Guilietti went before them with a scheme whereby the first month's increase and a portion of every month's wages thereafter were to be set aside to create a fund with which the workers should purchase ships. His proposal was received with great enthusiasm and there was constituted among the workers of the sea a co-operative named after the Italian national hero Garibaldi, himself a seaman. To quote the constitution, the co-operative was organized "with unlimited capital for a period of four years and renewable thereafter;" its purpose to "carry on navigation by means of national ships; to aid the Italian merchant marine; to aid in the economic and moral development of the workers of the sea." However, a threatened shortage of coal will probably curtail the output of the cement plants in the near future.

To meet the shortage it is reported that the Canadian trade commissioner in Auckland has arranged for the importation of 3,000 tons of Canadian cement to be delivered here within the next few months.
