MONTREAL, Jan. 2.—A cable despatch from St. John's, Nfid., to The Montreal Daily Mall announces that William Duff Re.d, president of the Reid Newfoundland Company, was created a knight in the New Year's honors. The order to which Mr. Reid was appointed is not created in the despatch.

William Duff Reid is a son of the late Sir Robert Gilespie Reid, a distinguished railway contractor, promoter and owner, and president of the Reid Newfoundland Company. He was born in Australia, March 20, 1867, and he came to Canada with his parents in 1871. He was associated with his father in constructing part of the Lake Superior section of the Canadian Pacific Railway, and also in building the C.P.R. bridge over the St. Lawrence River at Lachine. He constructed on his own account the Algoma branch of the C.P.R. and the branch of the Intercolonial Railway from Hawkesbury to Grand Narrows, Cape Breton. He was later associated with his father in the construction of the Reid-Newfoundland Railway. After his father's death, in 1908, he became president of this railway company.


