Champion Show Horses For Red Cross Benefit

New York, Dec. 18.—After winning five championship prizes and innumerable blue ribbons at the recent National Horse Show, James Cox Brady, owner of Hamilton Farm, Gladstone, N.J., has donated all his winnings to help swell the Red Cross benefit. He has ordered a special sale of his show horses at Dunfield's Riding Academy on Dec. 27. Mr. Brady was the largest exhibitor at Madison Square Garden this year. His stable comprises more hunters, harness horses and ponies than any other in the country. It is said that Mr. Brady intends to

breed and exhibit ponies alone in the future, and color is given to this report by the absence from the sale of King Largo, a shetland pony stallion, for the National Horse Show. This pony was beaten the first time his new owner exhibited him at the Garden, but the judges revised their opinion the next time he came before them. Among the well known winners to be sold are the champion hunters Kikee and Lord Melrose, and the imported hackney harness horses Argo and Prudley, reserve champion at the Garden, Pineson and Farena Regal, Queen of Earth and Follyport Brunella, Fairy Tread and Hamilton Star.

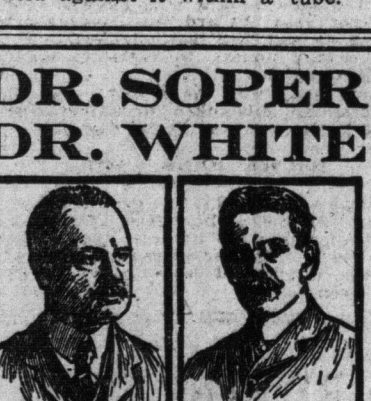
