board. The report drawn up on Jan.
30 was revised and several changes
made. At the Jarvis-street Collegiate
L. N. Gundy's standing on the schedule was raised from that of six to
seven years' service, entitling him to
\$100 per annum increase.

seven years' service, entitling him to \$100 per annum increase.

Miss Margaret Davidson of the domestic science department will receive \$50 increase. Miss Clara Brett Martin, an enthusiastic domestic science supporter on the board, expressed the opinion that teachers of this subject should receive from \$1500 to \$2000 per annum instead of \$1050 as at present, but the rest of the board, while recognizing the value of the subject, could not see fit that way.

In the secretary-treasurer's department Mr. Wilkinson, the secretary-treasurer, and Mr. Burns, accountant, each receive \$100 increase, while Messenger Lumsden gets \$675 instead of

\$650.

Female assistant teachers will reach their maximum of salary after 12 years' instead of 14 years' experience and will receive \$30 increase per year instead of \$25, the maximum being \$680. Miss Mitchell of the special teachers' list is recommended for \$50, \$680. Mr. Levee and Miss Martin opposed many suggested increases, and the former expressed the opinion that the whole list of salaries to teachers should be recommend.


