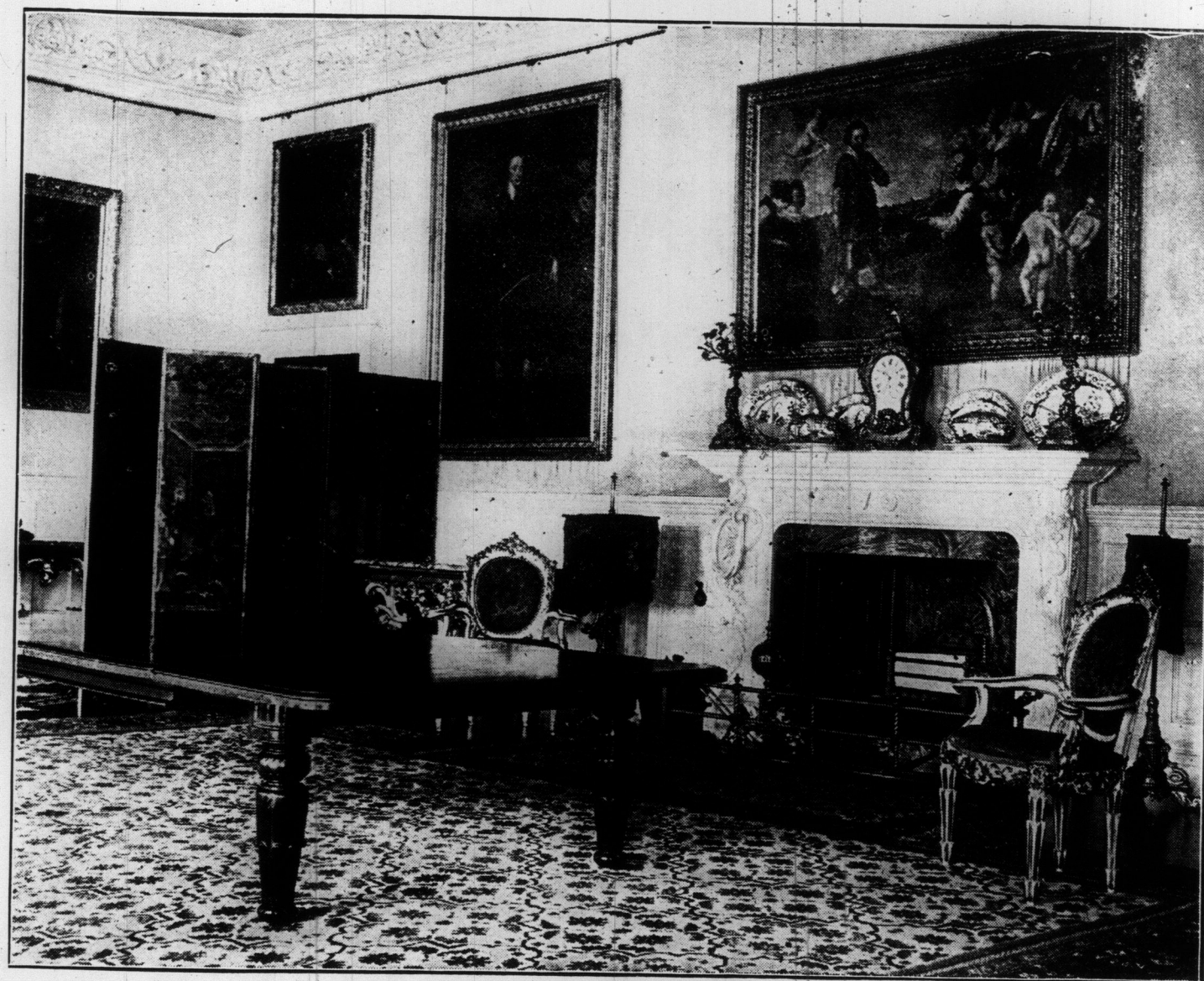


NOVEL SCHEME FOR ENTERTAINMENT OF COLONIAL VISITORS TO CORONATION.

London is rapidly filling with visitors from every part of the British Empire for the Coronation and a variety of interesting schemes are being matured for their entertainment. Amongst the most novel and important of these is one conceived and carried out by Mr. Norton Griffiths, M. P., wealthy and rapidly-rising young politician of the Unionist side of the House of Commons, who believes that quiet week-end parties amidst restful and beautiful surroundings will appeal to distinguished colonial visitors almost more than anything else. To this end Mr. Norton Griffiths, who is an enthusiastic Imperialist, has leased Temple House, a magnificent and historical mansion near Henley, in the midst of the most exquisite scenery in the Thames Valley, and is inviting the leading representatives from Canada and other overseas dominions of the Empire, their friends in England and leaders of the Unionist party, to make it their informal rendezvous every week-end. RIVER FRONT FROM THE WEST, TEMPLE HOUSE, HURLEY LOCK.



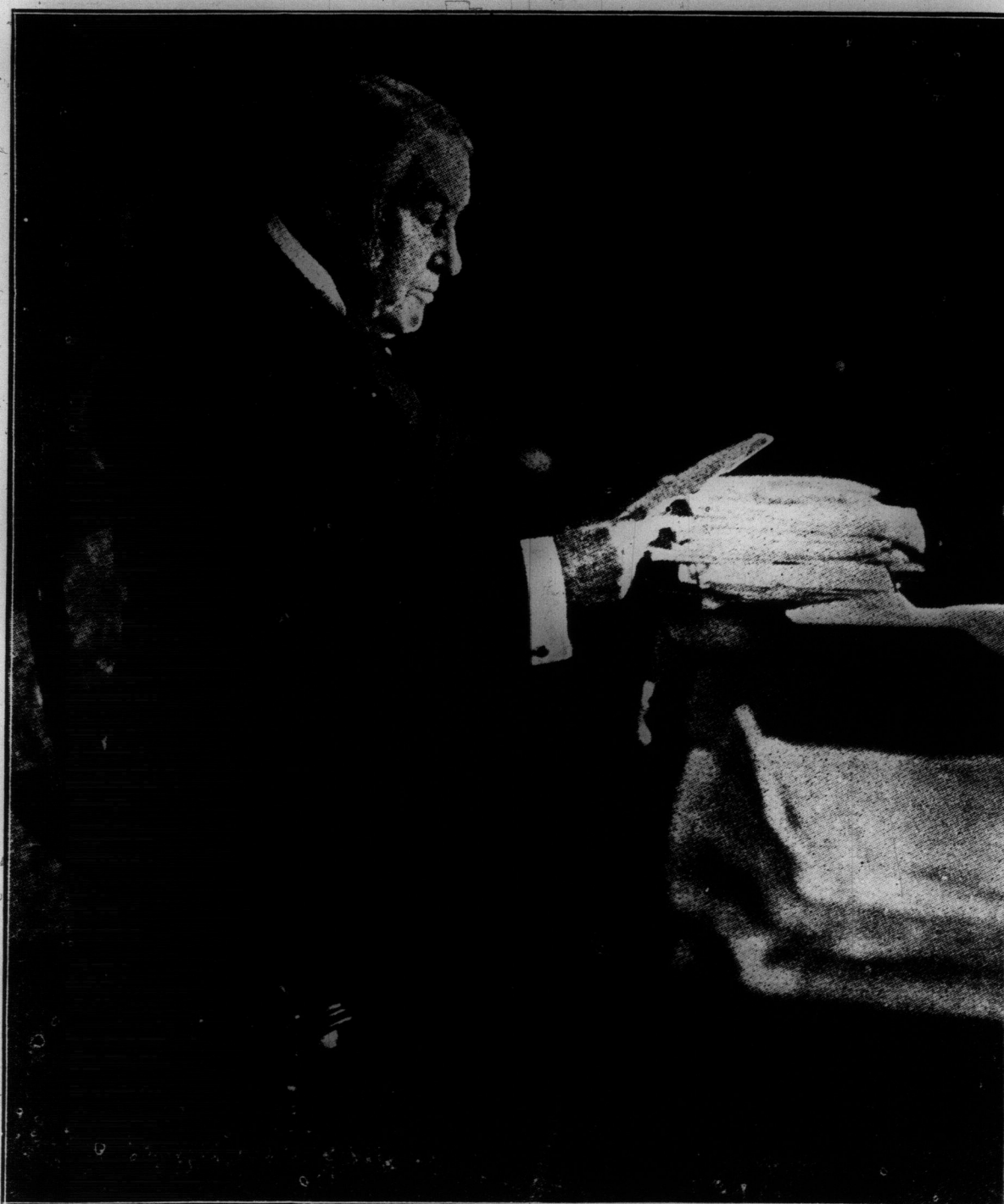

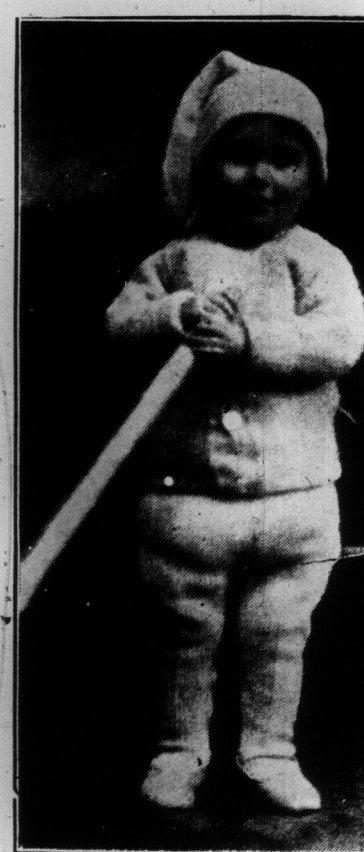
SUN DIAL, FLANKED BY GOLD EN YEW TREES, TEMPLE HOUSE, HURLEY LOCK.



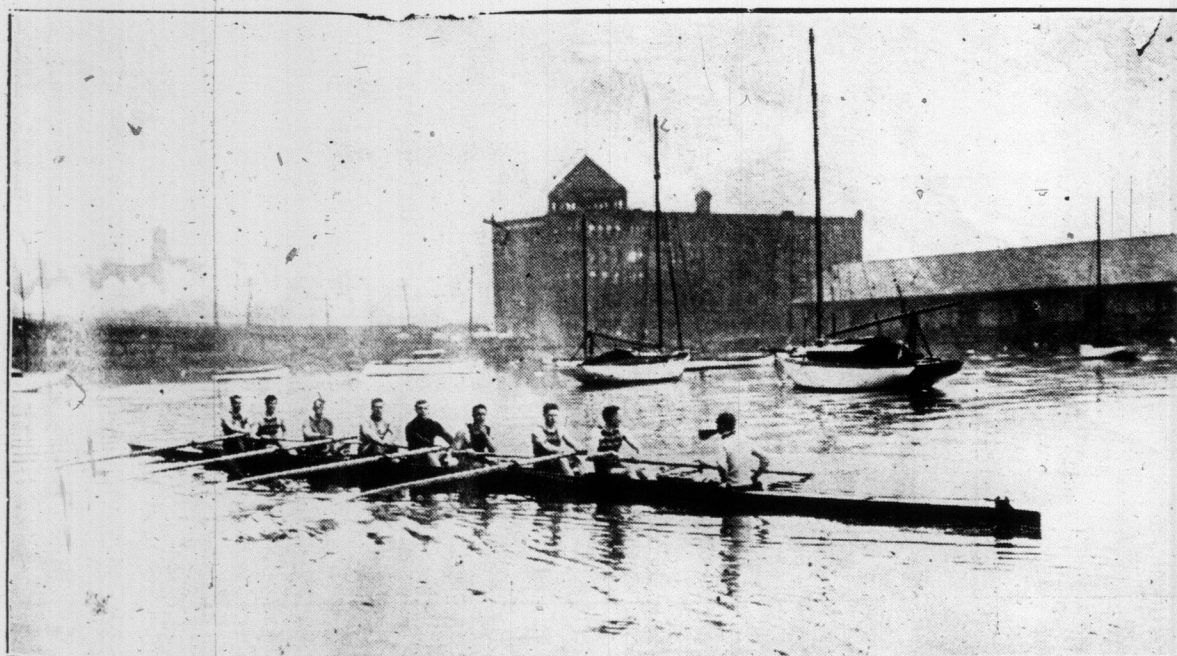
MAIN ENTRANCE, TEMPLE HOUSE, HURLEY LOCK.
