Who is Lucy Dalton? Lucy Dalton was the first of the feminine gender to roll into North Bay puffing smoke. A regular speed artist she was, and she rolled her own. Apart from all this she is a wood-burning locomotive built in Taunton, Mass., by William Mason in 1872, and she came off the old St. Lawrence and Ottawa Railway (now the Pres-cott branch of the Canadian Pacific) upon the construction of the C. P. R. in consummation of Confederation

She was called the Lucy Dalton in honor of the elster-in-law of Lord Lisgar, who was then Governor-General. She was afterwards assigned the road number "92." When North Bay became a town the other day Lucy tried to forget that she was old, but as is the case with so many old ladles of today, it was necessary to put a Ford chassis under her before she could go very far.
