Alterations—Canadian Pacific Suburban Service, St. John-Welsford, Effective After September 9, 1922

Daylight saving time will be abolished midnight, September 9th, and after that date Atlantic Time will be restored in the city.

Suburban train schedules will be adjusted accordingly and in addition preliminary curtailments in this service will be made, particulars as given below.

Effective after September 9th, trains leaving the city at 11:20 a.m. and 8:10 p.m. will be cancelled; trains arriving from Welsford at 2:25 p.m. and 7:00 p.m. cancelled.

Train No. 128 now leaving at 7:15 a.m. and train No. 127 now leaving at 8:50 a.m. will continue in service until September 16th, after which date they will be cancelled. Between September 9th and 16th, account of abolition of daylight, train will leave at 8:15 a.m. and arrive at 10:50 a.m.

Train No. 130, now arriving at 8:45 a.m., and train No. 127 now leaving at 8:10 p.m. will be continued in service until September 30th and then cancelled. After September 9th, train No. 127 will leave at 6:10 p.m. and train No. 129 will arrive at 6:45 a.m.

On Saturdays from September 16th to October 28th, there will be a noon suburban train service between St. John and Welsford which will be withdrawn with the exception of the 12:20 p.m. and the 8:00 o'clock arrival from Welsford on Saturdays.

After September 16th and until further notice the McAdam express train No. 101 and 102 will be made flag stop at Ketepepe and Onondaga.

After September 9th, train 106 will leave Fredericton at 5:10 a.m., arrive St. John at 7:30 a.m.

Eastern standard time, covers all above figures, which is one hour slower than Atlantic.

BOND ISSUES

Figures Argue Well for Financial Status of the United Kingdom.

London, Sept. 16 — (By Canadian Press)—Up to the beginning of August, this year, foreign and colonial government and municipal capital issues have totalled 11,650,000 pounds sterling, taking only issues publicly offered.

Foreign countries accounted for 48,201,800 pounds sterling, while colonial issues were created to the extent of 63,443,000 pounds.

Considering that the grand total of capital subscribed for in Great Britain both home and abroad to the end of July

was 183,744,922 pounds sterling, at least sixty per cent. of this amount has gone abroad. These figures argue well for the financial status and recuperative powers of the United Kingdom.

Australia has been the heaviest borrower, the commonwealth and her provinces raising 32,000,000 pounds sterling, at an average interest rate of 6 1/2 per cent. India borrowed about 28,000,000 pounds sterling, while New Zealand and the Straits Settlements account for nearly 10,000,000 pounds sterling.

India also placed an internal rupee loan in July for an unlimited amount carrying six per cent. at par. Several conversion offers were also included, and as the securities rating for conversion were largely held in this country, another large unknown amount found its way overseas.

New Zealand was a fairly private borrower, three municipalities placing moderate loans during the summer.

France, the biggest foreign applicant, raised 20,000,000 pounds sterling, of which 2,500,000 was for her shipping industry and 15,000,000 for railways. Denmark took away 2,500,000 pounds sterling and Brazil 7,000,000. Siam and Czecho-Slovakia borrowed for the first time in British markets.

CONVERSION PROPOSALS

Holders of the maturing bonds who wish to avail themselves of this conversion privilege should take their bonds AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE, BUT NOT LATER THAN SEPTEMBER 30th, to a Branch of any Chartered Bank in Canada and receive in exchange an official receipt for the bonds surrendered, containing an undertaking to deliver the corresponding bonds of the new issue.
