**INSPECTORS NAB PROMINENT MEN**

Police are Reticent Over the Arrest and Conviction.

(Ottawa Journal)

Two men prominent in public life in Ottawa on important business, were arrested yesterday afternoon by provincial and city police, charged with breach of the Ontario Temperance Act. They were only released after parting with the statutory \$200 and costs.

Mr. W. P. Lett, clerk of city police court. The names of the two culprits were carefully suppressed by the provincial and city police, who refused to impart any information.

Both men were arrested as they were coming from Hull each with a bottle of whiskey in his possession, it was learned. Provincial Constable Marshall and city police officers brought them up to the police station. The usual regulations for the registration of prisoners were dispensed with, and they were taken directly before Mr. Lett. Questioned later, Mr. Lett stated that he had forgotten the names of the men who appeared before him also that he was not aware of their positions.

Members of the Provincial police force were even more secretive than the city police. Inspector Jordan declared that orders had been received from Toronto not to impart information to the press until the prisoners appeared in open police court. He would not say anything about cases settled out of police court.

Inspector Howard Graham also refused to divulge the names of the two men arrested. Provincial Constables and city police officers were also asked to discuss the matter or to divulge the names of their prisoners.

The equipment of the Allison grounds for track sports to be brought up at the next regular meeting.

Mrs. George Disbark submitted the treasurer's statement, showing receipts: City grants, \$1,484.21 and \$3,025.41, a bequest of \$50, from the estate of Mrs. Barbour, and total receipts amounting to \$5,579.88. Expenses incurred for the playgrounds, \$4,001; for the Boys' Club, \$1,849; furniture for the Boys' Club, \$1,849; total of expenditures amounted to \$7,699.78. The balance was \$788.10 and \$874.46 was due from the city, making a total available funds for the current year, \$1,462.64, with outstanding bills, \$2,900.56. Mrs. Disbark had on hand for the Boys' Club building fund, from the proceeds of entertainments and the sale of the work of the playgrounds, \$3,631.11, with the amounting, reported by Miss Heffer made the total, \$4,062.11.

Mr. Belding explained it was proposed to secure a suitable site and erect a building for the Boys' Club, as the present premises were unsuitable but the only ones available. The sum had been raised in the last year, largely through Miss Heffer's interest.

It was announced that Mrs. J. S. Flahar had donated two sums of \$10, to be given to the best boys in the two clubs. Thanks were extended to Mrs. Flahar and she was cordially greeted on her first appearance for some time. It was decided two prizes should be awarded for each club, one for boys over fourteen and one for boys under fourteen.

**STUDENTS IN BERLIN CANNOT FIND LODGINGS**

Berlin, Nov. 18.—(A. P. by mail)—Thousands of students attending the University of Berlin are without lodgings, according to the rector of the institution, who has issued an appeal to citizens of Berlin to take in the homeless young men who have gathered here to attend the fall term.

The enrollment at universities in Germany this year has reached a total of 60,000, the highest since a little after the armistice. Forty thousand students last summer engaged in manual labor to meet their living expenses, and thousands of them finding employment as miners.
