The customs, as is customary in these cases, handed over portion of the money received from the sale of the liquor seized to the informant, who was Chief of Police Liddell. Officer McPherson claims that he should have got the major share of the money and was anxious to have a distribution made among the other men of the force. He has started suit to recover the sum.
